Context:

Background Information

The internship is in the Policy and Programme Support Unit which is responsible for ensuring a coherent approach across all IOM programmes managed and implemented by the Thailand Country Office.

Supervision

Under the overall supervision of Chief of Mission (CoM) in Thailand and the direct supervision of the Policy and Programme Support Coordinator, the Intern – Reporting (Policy and Programme Support Unit) will be able to support IOM Thailand's efforts to enhance overall reporting capacity in Thailand.

Core Functions / Responsibilities:

1. Support the development, compilation, and timely submission of donor reports, as well as other mission-specific reports or donor proposals, ensuring accuracy and compliance with donor and organizational requirements.

2. Provide technical support to Programme Units on the use of PRIMA, as needed.

3. Support IOM's role as secretariat of the UN Migration Network, organizing network activities and supporting the development of Network reports.

4. Participate in and provide support for program-related meetings and conferences at both the national and international levels.

5. As part of the Policy and Programme Support Unit (PPSU), support other PPSU functions as needed. This includes project development, monitoring and evaluation and compliance.

6. Undertake travel duties relating to project/programme monitoring, liaison with counterparts, problem solving, and new project/programme development, as required.

7. Perform such other duties as may be assigned.

For this position, fluency in English is required (oral and written). Working knowledge of Thai and another official UN language (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian, and Spanish) is an advantage.

Proficiency of language(s) required will be specifically evaluated during the selection process, which may include written and/or oral assessments.

c) are sponsored by governmental/non governmental institutions and/or academia to work in specific areas relevant to both IOM and the sponsor.

d) are either enrolled in the final academic year of a first university degree programme (minimum Bachelor's level or equivalent) or have graduated in the last 12 months. e) are at least 20 years old.
